It has been over a year since AAHWC has become an official organization in the NAD, and it is my great pleasure to welcome you to the organization and our first e-newsletter. AAHWC consists of a wide variety of health-minded Seventh-day Adventists that range from certified coaches to lay coaches, to health professionals, to professional and lay educators, to medical professionals and those with an interest in coaching. It is our intent at the AAHWC to connect people together who are passionate about healthy gospel living and interested in learning, sharing the message, and supporting others to do the same. We truly pray this organization will turn into a blessing of sharing knowledge and encouraging one another on our way to heaven, as we bring many others with us.
